his year marks Beta's 125th year at the University of Minnesota, and our Housing Corporation meets regularly to preserve our chapter house.

The current Beta Pi house has loyally served our members since 1927 and is the source of an abundance of fond memories. Dating back to our founding in 1889, our chapter has initiated more than 1,800 men. The chapter house is the first place that lifelong

NEW ROOF WILL BE INSTALLED

challenges. For example, in May we will replace the

roof, which has caused leaks in bedrooms and ceilings

on the third floor. This may be a \$50,000+ expense; but

once installed, a new roof will provide energy savings,

We have also completed other quick fixes that the

property has urgently required, such as removing mold caused by water leaks and replacing the water heater.

These fixes are critical, but also deplete our reserve funds,

which has created urgency for larger-scale renovations

and long-term solutions. Starting with improvements to

safety and compliance, there are several needed changes

Brian graduated with a B.A. in economics. He works as chief

strategy officer and co-founder of Thrill On, a social media outlet for outdoor enthusiasts to share their adventures and connect with other thrill-seekers. "I met another entrepreneur who had the idea. At the time, I wasn't looking for an e-commerce opportunity and told him he should think about something more social. He did it and blew me away. That seed of an idea has grown into a few million monthly users and millions of videos, pictures, and gear."

His initial interest in entrepreneurship took hold as a Beta. Along with another brother, Brian started a business selling book bags. "It was a great idea, but we didn't really know what we were doing. It was an awesome experience that left me with a taste for being on my own."

The desire to start his own business might not have come about had he not been a part of Beta Theta Pi. Brian maintains a network of brothers who keep in touch on a regular basis and considers those friendships to be lifelong. "Beta Pi is a brotherhood. We care about each other and genuinely root for each other. We always looked after one another, and we're always thrilled when we hear of successes of one another. It's hard to find those types of friends."

Brian and his wife, Brenda, live in Greenfield, Minnesota, and have four children. In addition to his busy work schedule, Brian also serves as chairman is his church, Riverwood, and as founder and chairman of Riverworks, a non-profit organization that feeds one in seven unique people in the Rockford/Greenfield community annually through a food shelf. 
